The Terms of Reference of the Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) are as follows:

1. The Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) will suggest the areas of research and will review the work done by the Council in the identified area. They may undertake such visits as the Chairman of the SAB may decide, to have an on the spot study of the work being done.
2. The SAB will also prioritize new areas of work which should be given a focus by the Council and its units for which detailed targets and strategies would be suggested by the Chairman of the SAB.

3. The SAB will give suggestion and directions for forging linkage with other institutions in respective fields including allopathic institutions with a view to mounting clinical trials which can determine the efficacy of the drugs and therapies. The SAB will also determine the areas which could lead to a significant impact on the health scene, keeping in mind epidemiological and demographic factor and gaps that exist in the current provision of healthcare which can be filled through Ayurveda/Siddha medicine.
4. The SAB would suggest areas where matters should be taken forward for patenting, marketing or for further collaborative research including the broad course of action to be pursued.
5. The SAB would suggest broad funding/pattern of assistance to enable the identified work to proceed in a cost-effective, time-bound and result-oriented fashion.
6. The SAB would recommend dropping of projects or revamping of projects/items of work keeping in mind the interest of best developing the sector in a reasonable time frame.
7. The SAB will recommend appropriate areas in which training programs have to be organized for the different functionaries in the Council and suggest organization of the workshop/training modules.
8. The SAB should suggest ways and means by which viable large scale dissemination of the benefits of the system can be achieved.
9. The SAB will consider other technical matters referred by the Finance Committee/Governing Body of the Council.
10. Any matter having financial implications, which calls for resources to be spent beyond the normal expenditure on salaries, equipment and consumables already incurred by the Council should come before SFC for approval. However, in case of any urgency, the Chairman of the Special Committee or SAB can send the papers through the Council Director to the President for approval.
11. The Member Secretary of the SAB shall ensure that the SAB meets once in every quarter and reviews the Research Projects of all the CRIs/RRIs and rates them on a scale of 0-5 and advise CCRAS to continue them or scrap them based on that rating.
