Pharmacological Study of some of the Cardio-vascular effects of Kutaki, Rohitaka, Kakamaci and Kasani used in the Management of Liver Disorders—A Preliminary Report

Four medicinal plants namely Kutaki (Picrorhiza kurroa Royle Ex Benth), Rohitaka (Tecomella undulata G Don Seam), Kakamaci (Solanum nigrum) and Kasani (Cichorium intybus Linn.) are commonly used in hepatic disorders in Indian Medicine. alcoholic extract of the different parts of these plants were studied on cardio-vascular systems of dog and frog. All the drugs caused bradycardia in normal hypodynamic heart of frog. Regarding dog's blood pressure and respiration, all the drugs elicited a fall in B.P. with a corresponding increase in respiratory rates. There was not considerable effect

shown by any drug on the heart of the dogs, except Kakamaci which caused depression in cardiac activity.
